EUSTACE CONWAY a celebrated naturalist brings the voices of the natural world and historic primitive experiences to life. As a cultural anthropologist he decided to truly explore his natural roots, leaving suburbia for the forest lifestyle at age 17. He canoed over 1000 miles on the Mississippi River at age 18. He walked the whole Appalachian Trail from Maine to Georgia at age 19. He kayaked the entire southern coast of Alaska in his early twenties. He rode his horse across America from the At-



lantic to the Pacific Ocean. He later took his horse and buggy 2,486 miles in 56 days, across the Canadian Plains and North Western US. He lived among primitive Mayan cultures in Guatemala and has insights into rare alternative lifestyle experiences. He lived in a tipi as a primary residence for seventeen years, then built a traditional log house with an ax and adze. He realized early on in life the importance of having a deeper connection with nature and began preaching a "get back to the land" attitude and speaking on the importance of knowing, understanding, and having a reverence for "where your stuff comes from." After years of public speaking as a highly visible role model, he bought hundreds of acres of land in the Blue Ridge Mountains of North Carolina and designed a unique educational program to provide people a place to experience personal contact with a pristine wilderness camp. Conway has built, directed, and maintained it with the help of interns and friends since 1987.



He has been featured several times on NPR, including "This American Life" with Ira Glass. He is the subject of award winning author Elizabeth Gilbert's "The Last American Man" and the independent documentary film "Full Circle: A Life Story of Eustace Conway." Eustace is one of the featured personalities in both the independent film Reconvergence and the History Channel series "Mountain Men." On his own, he produced several how-to videos on traditional living and he and his farmstead were highlighted on the PBS show "Folkways" — with historian David Holt. He continues to finance, design, and direct the multi-faceted educational programs on the forested campus of Turtle Island Preserve - now a 501c3 nonprofit environmental education center and Appalachian heritage farm in the mountains of Boone, NC - where he resides to this day.

With the hundreds of articles and feature stories that have been published about his tenacious journeys and alternative life choices, Eustace has always turned the attention back to the root conviction that we must know our natural environment to honor, celebrate, understand and love the precious earth that gives us life. He committed his life to service at a young age and



continues to share his message both onsite at Turtle Island Preserve and on guest appearances by request.
